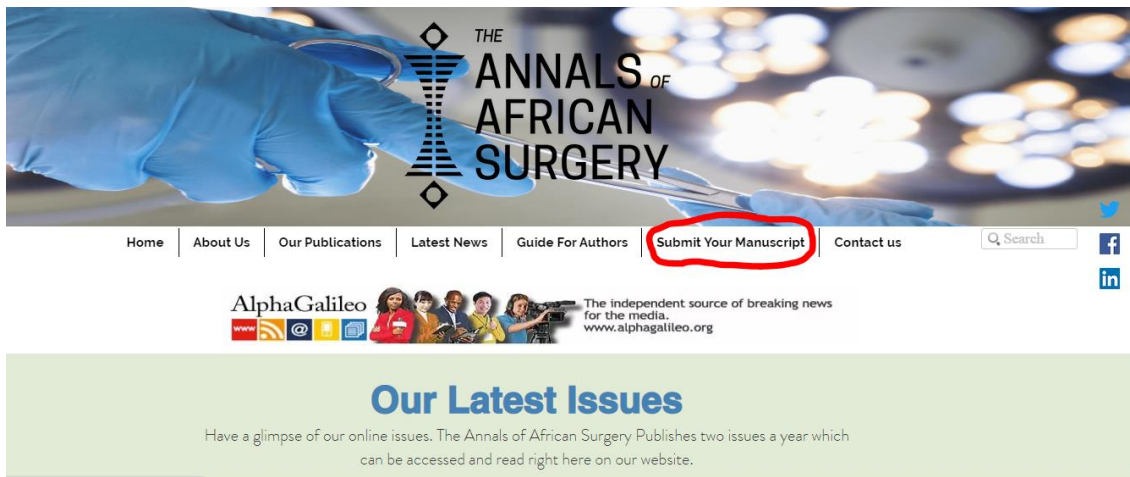


How to submit papers to the Annals of African Surgery via ScholarOne manuscript submission system.


The Annals of African Surgery is the Premier Surgical read in Africa. The Journal uses the ScholarOne manuscript submission system from Elsevier for the submission & subsequent processing of its manuscripts. Below is a tutorial on the steps of how to use the ScholarOne system.

- a) First, ensure that your manuscript is formatted as per the requirements of the Annals of African Surgery journal requirements (<https://www.annalsofafricansurgery.com/guide-for-authors>)
- b) Visit the Annals of African Surgery website (<https://www.annalsofafricansurgery.com/>)
- c) Go to the “Submit your Manuscript” option on the AAS website



- d) This will take you to the ScholarOne submission page



Why publish your paper at the Annals of African Surgery?

1. The Annals of African Surgery (AAS) has been cited as a Premier Surgical read in Africa (Reference).
2. It is currently indexed in the DAOJ, SCOPUS, Hinari, AJOL.
3. No article processing charger (APC) are imposed on any submissions to the Journal.
4. All papers submitted to the AAS are usually subjected to a plagiarism check prior to being processed.
5. The AAS uses the ScholarOne manuscript submission system which ensures expeditious review process, while the authors can track the progress/ status of their papers.
6. All papers undergo rigorous peer-review process prior to acceptance for publication.
7. All accepted papers appear on the “Online First” section of the Journal’s website prior to full text availability.
8. The AAS publicized all its articles via multiple social media platforms to ensure visibility.
9. Quick turn-around time (2020- time to first decision is approximately 20-30 days form submission date).
10. The AAS is run by highly distinguished and competent editorial team, supported by a robust Editorial board with members from within and outside Africa.
